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## II. AUTHORITY

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Because the Subject Money was furnished or intended to be furnished by any person in exchange for a controlled substance or listed chemical in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(7).

2	Audomar Valenzuela Sanchez, Claimant, is a person who the Tribes knows or has
3	reason to believe has or may asset a claim to the subject property. Audomar Valenzuela
4	Sanchez is believed to reside 16520 North Road, Apt. G205, Bothell, WA 98012 (Police
	Report).
5	IV. CONCLUSION
6	Based upon the foregoing, the Tribes requests the Clerk of the Court issue a Summons
7	to have Audomar Valenzuela Sanchez answer the allegations of this Petition, and, ultimately,
8	for the Court to order that the Subject Property be forfeited for the benefit of the Tulalip
9	Tribes.
