Notice of Petition for Forfeiture and Summons by Publication

The Tulalip Tribes Office of Reservation Attorney gives notice that the property listed below was seized for forfeiture for violation of Tribal Law. Laws and procedures applicable to the forfeiture process can be found in Tulalip Tribal Code (TTC) Chapters 2.10 and 2.60. TO FILE A CLAIM: If you are an owner or claimant, you may contest the forfeiture of the property listed below by filing an answer with the Tribal Court no later than 30 days after the date of final publication of this notice. You must serve a copy of your answer on the Tribal Prosecutor. You may request a copy of the summons, petition, and evidence in your case from the Tribal Prosecutor.

13 YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that the Tulalip Tribes, Plaintiff, by and through its
14 prosecuting authority, has filed a petition with the Court that seeks to have forfeited, to the
15 benefit of the Tribes, certain property that you allegedly own, claim, or have an interest.

16 Pursuant to Chapter 2.60.070§(4)(a), of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law, you have thirty
17 (30) days after you have been served the petition and this summons to file with the Court a
18 response to the allegations described in the petition. No extension of the time for filing the
19 response may be granted. Failure to respond within 30 days may bar you from presenting
20 evidence at any later evidentiary hearing regarding the seized property. Further, if no response
21 is filed within 30 days after service of the petition and summons, the Court, upon motion of the
22 Tribes, shall order the property forfeited to the Tribes.

23 Chapter 2.60.070§(4)(b) governs responses to forfeiture petitions. The Clerk's Office
24 does not provide legal advice. It is your responsibility to familiarize yourself with the applicable

COMES NOW the Tulalip Tribes, Plaintiff, by and through its prosecuting authority, to petition the Court to institute proceedings for the forfeiture of the property described in section I, below. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over these proceedings, and this Petition is made pursuant to, Chapter 2.60 of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law.

I. SUBJECT PROPERTY

As described in detail in Tulalip Police Incident Report #20-0720, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 1st day of October, 2020, Tulalip Tribal Police (TPD) seized a \$20 from Christopher Borovina in the vicinity of 9400 block of Turk Drive, Tulalip, Washington in connection with narcotics trafficking on the Tulalip Reservation.

II. AUTHORITY

Because the Subject Money was furnished or intended to be furnished by any person in exchange for a controlled substance or listed chemical in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(7).

III. CLAIMANTS


Christopher Borovina, from whom the subject property was seized, is the only person who the Tribes knows or has reason to believe has or may assert a claim to the subject property. Christopher Borovina is believed to be residing at 9613 12th Avenue NW, Tulalip, Washington 98271 (JIS).

IV. CONCLUSION

Based upon the foregoing, the Tribes requests the Clerk of the Court issue a Summons to have Christopher Borovina answer the allegations of this Petition, and, ultimately, for the Court to order that the Subject Property be forfeited for the benefit of the Tulalip Tribes.
